## KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

### Dr. Julian Dunster

Julian Dunster is the Past President of the Pacific Northwest Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture and the lead instructor and course designer for the Certified Tree Risk assessment program. He has undertaken arboriculture, environmental planning, urban design, and forestry consulting work in Canada, Britain, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Australia, New Zealand, Nepal, and Chile. He has delivered lectures on his work all over the world, with an emphasis on trees and environmental issues, conservation and designs that will contribute to better environmental awareness. He has served on several Boards of Directors, audit committees and panels and has considerable expertise with non-profit groups in the environmental sector, helping them to develop strategies for promoting their goals and deliver effective critiques and messages. He has published several books and numerous articles. His book *Arboriculture and the Law in Canada* was published by the International Society of Arboriculture in 1987.



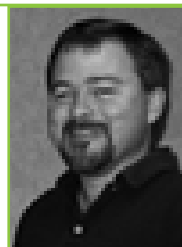
### Joe Murray

This fast-paced, comprehensive course is for the novice interested in becoming a Certified Arborist or seasoned arborists that have years of experience. Although this course explores basic arboricultural information, even professional athletes continue to work on the basics. This course will provide arborists with basic arboricultural information that has practical applications in the field. This intensive 6.5-hour training will be divided into two sessions: 1) an extensive examination of tree biology

and soil and water relationships; 2) application of principles learned in the morning will be used as a basis for discussing accepted arboricultural practices.

Presenters are experienced working arborists from varied backgrounds in arboriculture and urban forestry. Attendees will enjoy an educational and entertaining learning experience.

This four-stop field study will encompass a wide variety of urban forestry issues from city parks to suburban parking lots. Starting at the Hollywood Arts Park—the centerpiece of the City of Hollywood's revitalized downtown—we will learn how the city preserved certain trees and relocated others, and how it dealt with the public relations aspects of this highly visible project. We will then travel to Fort Lauderdale Beach and look at the successful mitigation and restoration efforts undertaken at Hugh Taylor Birch State Park.

The next stop will focus on the intense pressures of development and growth in western Broward County, where we will visit Robbins Farm and hear about the history and management of the town of Davie's open space program.

On our way back to Weston, we will stop in neighboring Cooper City for a case study in the effectiveness of applying landscape codes to commercial sites and so-called "Big Box" retail developments.

## 3 | Pruning Methods: New Research May Change Everything, or Nothing

Then we will show details on how and why trees fail and how to prevent it. We will teach you what to look for when evaluating trees for potential failure and how to treat these trees. We will thoroughly decipher thinning, reduction, raising, and structural pruning. We will also discuss root stability issues related to planting practices and other up-to-the-minute arboriculture practices. You will go home with a new understanding of how and why we prune trees and how to apply it to most real life situations. This fast-paced presentation will help you provide the very latest in tree health care to your customers.

### ROPE ACCESS

Participants will train in the use of specialized equipment and techniques used in establishing overhead tie-in locations and the hardware, knots and hitches used to access tall or confined tree canopies. Focus is on using rope to access your work location, without spurs, while maintaining and following safe work practices and legislation pertaining to fall protection. Educating participants in the application of forces in various rope access systems such as single rope technique (SRT) configurations and the definition of specific rope terms, knots, hitches and hardware completes this very informative course.
